
## not as ... as

Α





She's old, but she's not as old as he is.

Box A isn't as big as Box B.

- Rome is not as old as Athens.
  - (= Athens is **older**)
- The Grand Hotel isn't as expensive as the Europa.

(= the Europa is more expensive)

O I don't play tennis as often as you.

(= you play more often)

The weather is better than it was yesterday. It **isn't as cold**.

(= as cold as it was yesterday)

- B not as much as ... / not as many as ...
  - ☐ I don't have **as much money as** you. (= you've got **more money**)
  - I don't know as many people as you. (= you know more people)
  - O I don't go out **as much as** you. (= you go out **more**)
- Compare not as ... as and than:
  - Rome is **not as old as** Athens.

    Athens is **older than** Rome. (*not* older as Rome)
  - Tennis **isn't as popular as** football. Football is **more popular than** tennis.
  - O I don't go out as much as you. You go out more than me.
- We usually say: as **me** / as **him** / as **her** etc. You can say:
  - She's not as old as him. or She's not as old as he is.
  - You don't work as hard **as me**. or You don't work as hard **as I do**.
- We say the same as ...:
  - The weather today is **the same as** yesterday.
  - My hair is **the same colour as** yours.
  - I arrived at the same time as Tom.
